Accessing our online resources and services

Member employees can and should be regularly accessing our free member resources and looking for education and events to support their professional development. To do this, each person should create their own log-in to the [Consult Australia website](#). Without this, you will not be able to access the free content or get the discounted rates on events and education.

How to create a log-in (if you have not already done so)

1. Click the 'LOG IN' button on the top of any page of the [Consult Australia website](#).
2. On the log in screen click 'Register as Web User' (hypertext under the 'Log in' button).
3. Fill-in the online form. Remember, all current Consult Australia members are searchable in the first field 'Find Company' – if you cannot find your company, please contact us at: info@consultaustalia.com.au. Without linking back to the member company, you will not receive full access to resources and member pricing for events.
