Engineering and design skills must be high on agenda at Jobs and Skills Summit

Strengthening STEM education, increasing skilled immigration and prioritising over-due procurement reform is critical to addressing the skills crisis faced by the engineering, design and advisory industry represented by Consult Australia.

<u>Thinking Smarter About Skills</u>, the new report by Consult Australia comes in anticipation of the Federal Government's Jobs and Skills Summit. Addressing the shortage of 52,100 engineers, scientists, and architects required to deliver Australia's burgeoning pipeline of public and private sector projects will need to be high on the Summit agenda.

Consult Australia, which represents companies that employ around 285,000 engineers, scientists and designers, identifies three roadblocks that require immediate action to alleviate the pressures caused by the current skills crisis. They include poor participation in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) education, red tape that prevents industry from accessing talent, and a worsening attrition rate.

Failure to address these factors will lead to further project delays and increased costs. Collectively these factors are threatening Australia's \$218 billion infrastructure pipeline as well as the significant built environment projects around the country. A pipeline that will deliver new roads to ease congestion, new rail to move people and goods safely and efficiently, critical water and sewerage upgrades to mitigate flooding and coastal erosion, and projects that are essential to reduce carbon emissions.

Nicola Grayson, Chief Executive of Consult Australia said, "The government's Jobs and Skills Summit is a step in the right direction, we must use it to unshackle our industry from the capacity constraints caused by a lack of engineers, designers, and related professionals. It is these consultants and advisers who turn big ideas into constructable reality – and drive productivity growth. Yet they face massive headwinds, from recruitment to accessing professional indemnity insurance."

In *Thinking Smarter About Skills* Consult Australia has made a series of recommendations that would help to remove these roadblocks. Consult Australia seeks to engage government, educators, and industry in a collaborative approach to adopting the solutions.
