THANKS FOR THE CASH BUT WHERE'S THE SUPPORT?

Infrastructure spending is once again at the centre of the Federal Budget but delivery challenges go unaddressed.

Consult Australia's membership takes centre stage in Australia's economic prosperity as infrastructure spending continues.

Consult Australia is the industry association representing consulting businesses in design, advisory and engineering, an industry comprised of over 58,600 businesses across Australia who employ over 285,000 people in architectural, engineering, and technical services, and many more in advisory and business support.

Nicola Grayson, Chief Executive of Consult Australia, said, "Continued investment in infrastructure is welcomed, however we are disappointed that the Budget measures don't provide policy support to ensure that the systemic barriers to our industry's productivity are addressed. Allocating the money is easy but long-term structural reform must not be left in the too hard basket.

"We are delighted that the Commonwealth has listened and responded to the issues we've raised on behalf of our small business members by requiring Commonwealth projects agencies to limit the extent of pre-contract insurance and liability requirements to reflect sufficient risk sharing while not imposing unreasonable or disproportionate risk transfer that unduly restricts the number of suppliers who can bid. This is an excellent step in the right direction but we need to see the adoption of these measures across all Commonwealth funded projects in Australia."

Skills shortages and poor procurement practices in the delivery of infrastructure need to be addressed to ensure Australian taxpayers get the best return on this investment for our future economic, social, and environmental prosperity.

"We need Federal Government support to boost tertiary education in engineering and related professional occupations, we also need legislative and policy reforms to ensure that governments are model clients in procuring infrastructure. The Federal Government has missed the opportunity to signal its support for the health of the businesses large and small and the people they employ who will be critical in delivering the infrastructure spend." said Grayson.

Consult Australia welcomes the investment in vocational education and training but highlights the need to boost investment in engineering and related tertiary education, noting that Infrastructure Australia found that there will be a peak public infrastructure workforce shortage of 70,000 engineers, scientists, and architects to 2025 based on the previous budget estimates.

"We need to think smarter about skills to create a vibrant workforce with the right capabilities and capacity to meet demands, with funding in place to support skilled migration, upskill those capable already in the community and strong policies to assist working parents." Grayson said.

Consult Australia now looks to the Federal election and the appetite to commit to a suite of policies that will remove the barriers to productivity and innovation across our industry.
