Perth's built environment consulting industry was last night recognised as a leading force in the Australian industry, with Perth-born firm, BG&E and a young professional from Arup awarded Gold at Consult Australia's annual Awards for Excellence.

Consult Australia Chief Executive Officer, Megan Motto commended the quality of the services delivered and the groundbreaking nature of the projects being delivered across the state alongside an exceptionally strong focus on staff and community.

BG&E took out a Gold Award in Safety in Design for the rebuild of the Mambo Tema Bridges in Tanzania, and was also awarded the Medium Firm of the Year for the second year running.

BG&E's overall objective on the Tanzania bridges project was to transfer skills to the locals and help create an environment where the firm's initial assistance would lead to a self-sustaining outcome.

"By working closely with the communities, we were able to transfer very practical knowledge and skills—helping them to become more prepared for future bridge maintenance tasks," said BG&E Director, Peter de Bruin.

The judges commended BG&E on this community focus; noting that it was an inspirational project—particularly for firms of a similar size who wanted to have a positive impact on communities.

Recognised as one of the biggest events in the industry, the Consult Australia Awards for Excellence attracted over 270 senior representatives from firms including: AECOM, Arup, GHD, Hyder Consulting, Norman Disney & Young, Parsons Brinckerhoff, SMEC Australia, and WorleyParsons.
